# EMERGENCY CWA D1 TOWN HALL MEETING

#### Wednesday April 2<sup>nd</sup> 7 pm

Executive Order bans collective bargaining for over 1 million federal workers

Last Thursday, the Trump administration escalated its war on workers by issuing an unprecedented Executive Order that strips over 1 million federal workers of their collective bargaining rights. Agencies have been ordered to terminate their collective bargaining agreements immediately and end payroll deductions for dues immediately.

#### What This Means

This is not just about AFGE. It's not just about federal workers. It's about all of us. An injury to one is an injury to all.

It's a direct attack on Our right to collective bargaining, ability to speak out and democracy itself. Project 2025 laid this out clearly. They plan to dismantle the federal workforce, privatize public services, and eliminate union power. This is just the beginning — unless we stop them.

Thank you for choosing to apply for one of two Federation of Social Workers' Scholarships. Listed below are the eligibility criteria:


- Applicants pursuing a higher degree must be the child or grandchild of a current FSW member or a current member of FSW Retiree Council in good standing, or FSW member in good standing must be the legal guardian to the applicant.
- 2. Applicants must have participated in at least 5 hours of FSW sponsored labor movement activities in the last 4 years. Documentation may be required.
- 3. Completed Ed Grabowski/Dina Finn Memorial Scholarship Application.
- 4. In the event that two approved applications for a child or grandchild are not received by July 18, 2025, applications will then be opened to any current FSW member pursuing a higher degree, with a deadline of August 15, 2025.

## APPLY NOW FOR JOE BEIRNE SCHOLARSHIPS

A pply now for college scholarships of \$4,000 each for the 2025-2026 school year, and another \$4,000 for 2026-2027. (2nd year award based on satisfactory academic record.)

Sixteen new scholarships will be awarded by CWA's Joe Beirne Scholarship Program. Eligible are CWA members, their spouses, children and grandchildren (including those of laid-off, retired or deceased members) planning for college studies.

Final deadline for applications is 11:59 p.m., EST, April 30, 2025.

Applications are easy to make online at the Foundation's website (including submission of a short original essay). Winners will be chosen in a lottery drawing.

The program honors CWA's founding president, who served for more than 30 years. Joe Beirne took great pride in the roles he played in furthering educational opportunity and working for social justice.
