#### <u>"The People Win: Korean Labor and Social Movements Defeat a Dictator"</u>

On December 4, just after U.S. elections brought Trump to power, the democratically elected president of South Korea, Yoon Suk Yeol, declared himself a dictator and invoked a military coupfrom-above.

Over the next four months, general strikes called by the KCTU and massive popular mobilizations of civil society fought relentlessly to defend democracy.

They ultimately prevailed when Yoon was impeached and thrown out of office on April 4.

This webinar, **which is free to attend**, will bring vivid first-hand accounts of this intense struggle from key leaders and offer inspiration to Americans facing a comparable crisis.

Thank you for choosing to apply for one of two Federation of Social Workers' Scholarships. Listed below are the eligibility criteria:


- Applicants pursuing a higher degree must be the child or grandchild of a current FSW member or a current member of FSW Retiree Council in good standing, or FSW member in good standing must be the legal guardian to the applicant.
- 2. Applicants must have participated in at least 5 hours of FSW sponsored labor movement activities in the last 4 years. Documentation may be required.
- 3. Completed Ed Grabowski/Dina Finn Memorial Scholarship Application.
- 4. In the event that two approved applications for a child or grandchild are not received by July 18, 2025, applications will then be opened to any current FSW member pursuing a higher degree, with a deadline of August 15, 2025.
